


### FY20 BUDGET DEVELOPMENT

- In order to maintain class sizes, staffing levels, and fee structures, we needed to spend an additional \$5 mil over FY19 levels, an increase of 3.48%.
  - Cost Drivers
    - Salaries
    - Benefits
    - Special Education
    - Transportation
- Revenues decreased in the FY20 Budget
  - Healthcare Waiver
  - Fund Balance (Surplus)
  - State Aid Reduction
- What we needed to maintain our programs and personnel was approximately \$135 mil. Our revenues are capped at \$130 mil, a \$5 mil shortfall.
- March 12 Referendum: \$5 mil for Financial Stability and \$3 mil for Full day Kindergarten



## CONSEQUENCES OF A FAILED REFERENDUM

- The Board is Considering
- Staff Reductions:
   Approximately 50 Positions
- Increase Fees
  - Technology
  - Pay to Play
  - Building Use
- Decreasing Courtesy Busing
- Final decisions will be made by April 29





- If we were fully funded in 2012-2013 (\$13 mil UNDERFUNDED)
- If we were funded for the special education students we proudly serve (\$1.5 mil UNDERFUNDED)
- If the referendum passed.

### TAX LEVY CAP

- 2% Increase from the 2018-2019 General Fund Tax Levy for Hillsborough and Millstone
  - \$1,910,355
- Healthcare Waiver
  - \$290,332
- Enrollment Adjustment
  - \$192,137



### HILLSBOROUGH TOWNSHIP ESTIMATED 2019 SCHOOL TAX RATE

- Annual DECREASE on a Home Assessed at \$400,000 in 2018 and 2019 is \$50.
- Tax Levy is Increasing by 2.33%
  - 2018-19 Local Tax Levy (General Fund and Debt Service): \$97,016,823
  - 2019-20 Local Tax Levy (General Fund and Debt Service): \$99,277,635
- Proposed Tax Rate of 1.595 on \$100 of Assessed Property
  - 2018 School Tax Rate: 1.607
  - 2019 Proposed Tax Rate: 1.595
- Tax Rate DECREASE of 0.77%

### MILLSTONE BOROUGH ESTIMATED 2019 SCHOOL TAX RATE

- Tax Levy is Increasing by 2.51%
  - 2018-19 Local Tax Levy: \$ 973,336
  - 2019-20 Local Tax Levy: \$ 997,719
- Tax Rate is 1.869 on \$100 of Assessed Property
  - 2018 Proposed Tax Rate: 1.826
  - 2019 Proposed Tax Rate: 1.869
- Tax Rate Increase of 2.37%
- Annual Increase on a Home Assessed at \$400,000 in 2018 and 2019 is \$173

# WHEN WILL THE BUDGET BE AVAILABLE FOR COMMUNITY REVIEW?

- Once the Board approves the tentative budget, it is then submitted to the Somerset County Department of Education for approval.
- Advertised budgets are published on April 19
- We will work with the county office to expedite approval and release the budget as early as possible.
